

# HEALTH AND HEALTH CARE FOR HISPANICS IN THE UNITED STATES



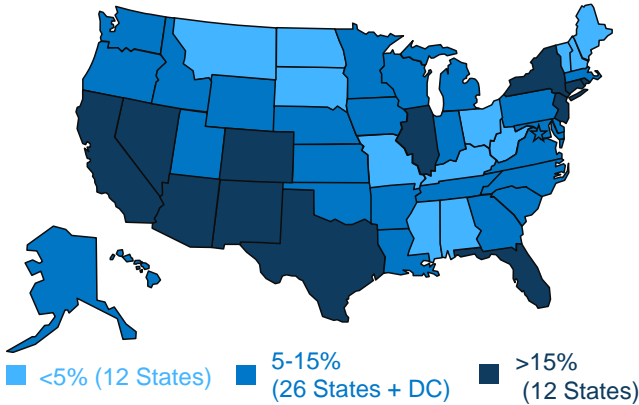
**2017** About 58 million people living in the U.S. are Hispanic, making up nearly 1 in 5 of the population.



**2060** Hispanics are projected to account for more than 1 in 4 people living in the U.S. by 2060.

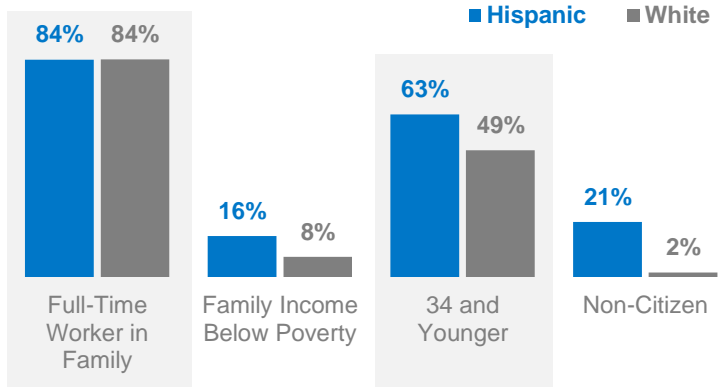
## Hispanics make up a greater share of the population in the west.

SHARE OF TOTAL POPULATION THAT IS HISPANIC BY STATE, 2017



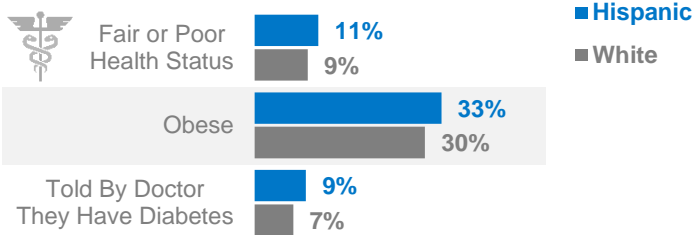
## Most nonelderly Hispanics are in a family with a worker, but are more likely to be poor than Whites.

## Hispanics face a range of health challenges.

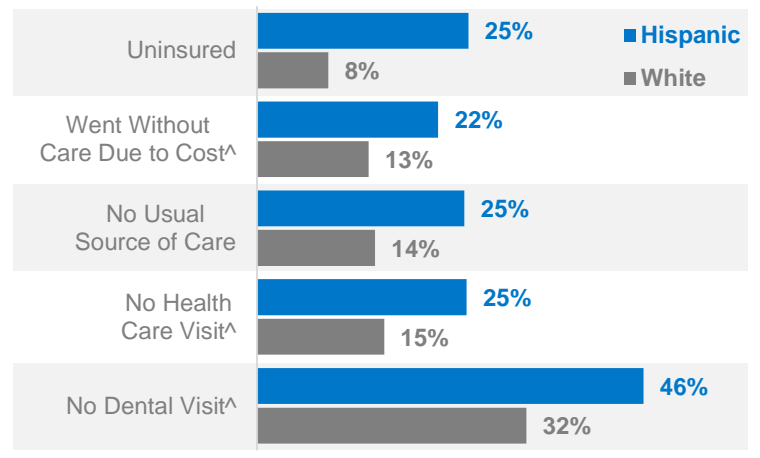
HEALTH STATUS AND SELECTED HEALTH CONDITIONS AMONG NONELDERLY ADULTS, 2017



More than **3x** AS LIKELY to be diagnosed with HIV THAN WHITES

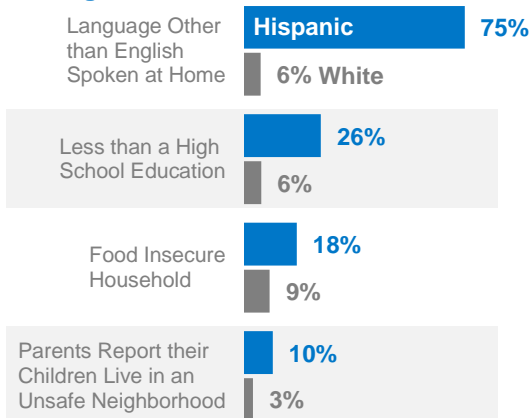
More than **2x** HIGHER teen birth rate THAN WHITES

## Among nonelderly adults, Hispanics face greater barriers to accessing care than Whites.



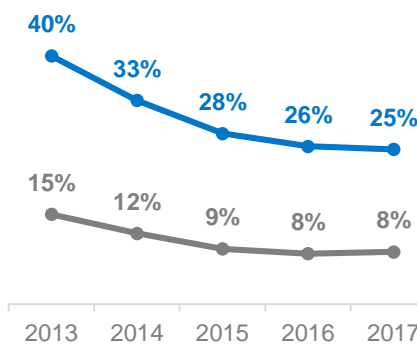

## Hispanics are more likely to have other characteristics that lead to health challenges.

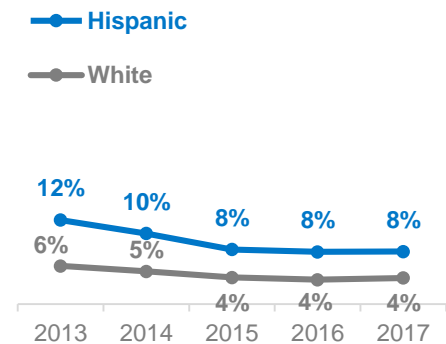


## The uninsured rate declined for Hispanics under the ACA, but they still remain more likely to be uninsured than Whites.
