

## Appendix A

As part of Kaiser Family Foundation's effort to examine the role of health care in the 2018 midterm elections, throughout the year we will be tracking the views of voters – paying special attention to those living in states or congressional districts in which both parties have a viable path to win the election. This group, referred to in our analysis as “voters in battlegrounds” is defined using the 2018 Senate, House, and Governor ratings provided by The Cook Political Report on April 27, 2018. Both congressional and gubernatorial races categorized as “toss-up” were included in the analysis group. In April 2018, this analysis group includes 500 individuals who say they are registered to vote and currently live in one of these states or congressional districts. The margin of sampling error for this group is +/- 5 percentage points and includes 161 Republicans, 149 Democrats, and 149 independents.
