

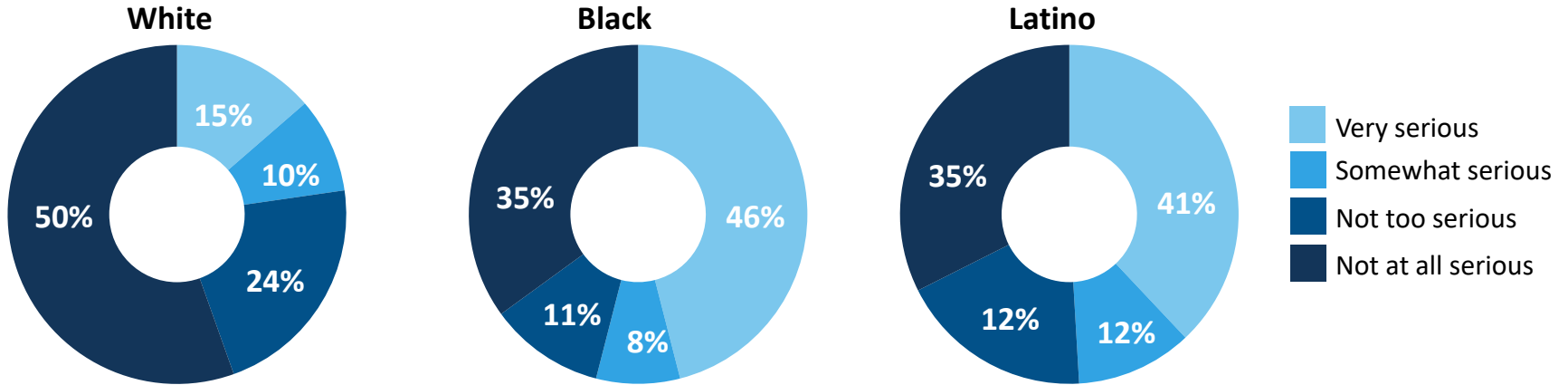

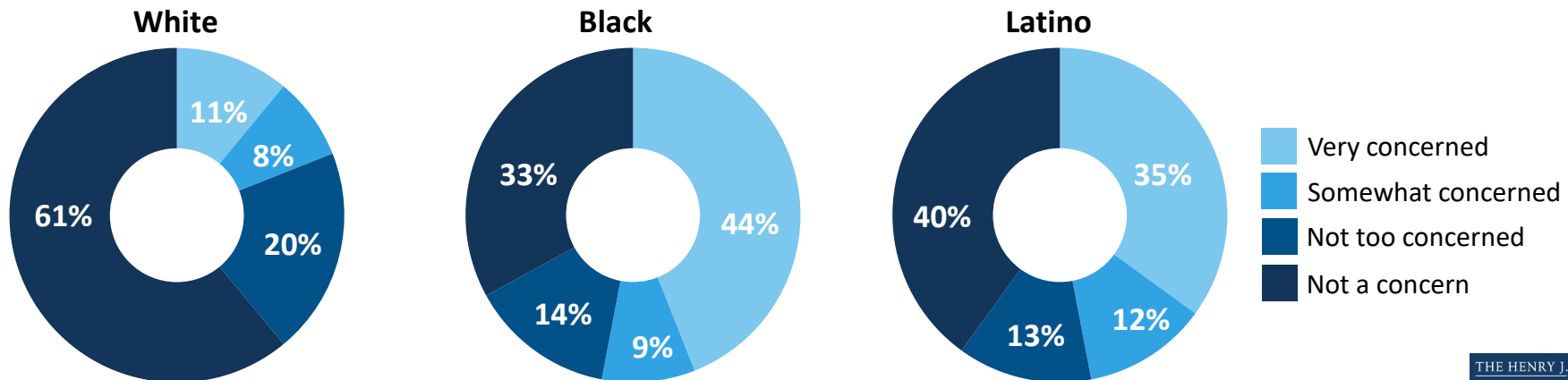
Community and Personal Concern about HIV/AIDS

“How serious of a concern is HIV/AIDS for *people you know*?”



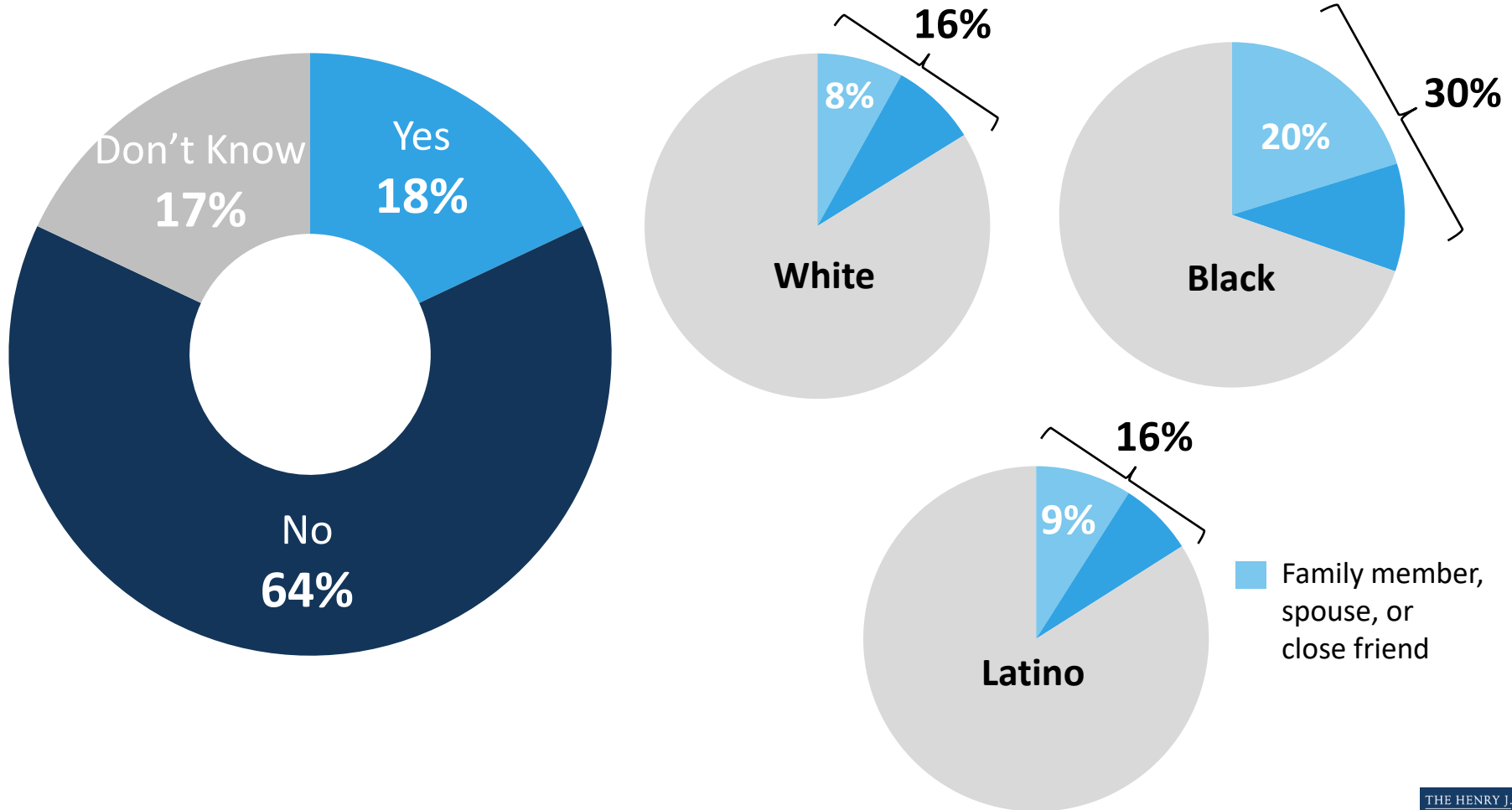
“How **concerned** are you *personally* about HIV/AIDS?”

“Do you know *personally* know anyone living with and/or who has died of HIV/AIDS?”



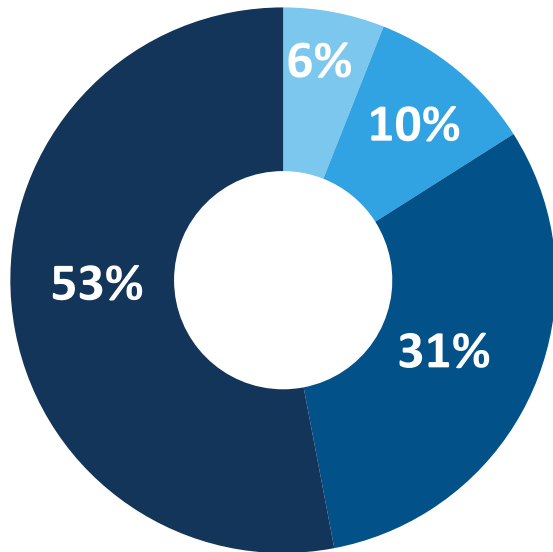

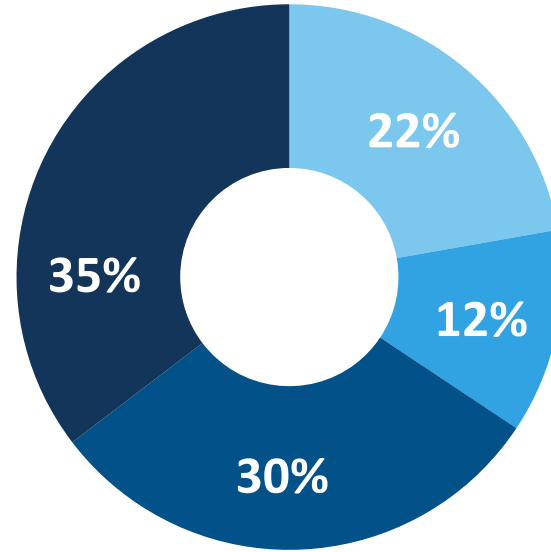

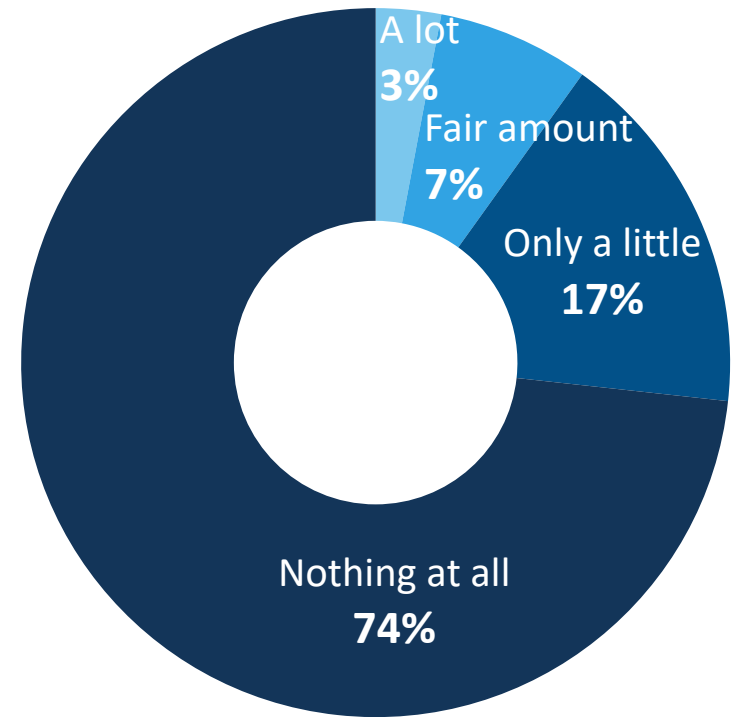
Awareness of PrEP

“As far as you know, is there a pill that people who do not have HIV can take to protect themselves from getting HIV, or does such a pill not exist?”



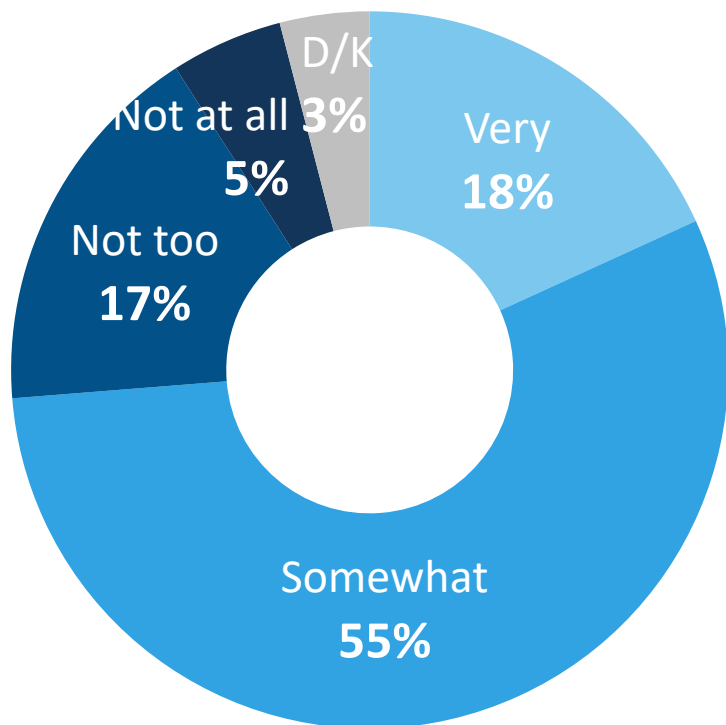

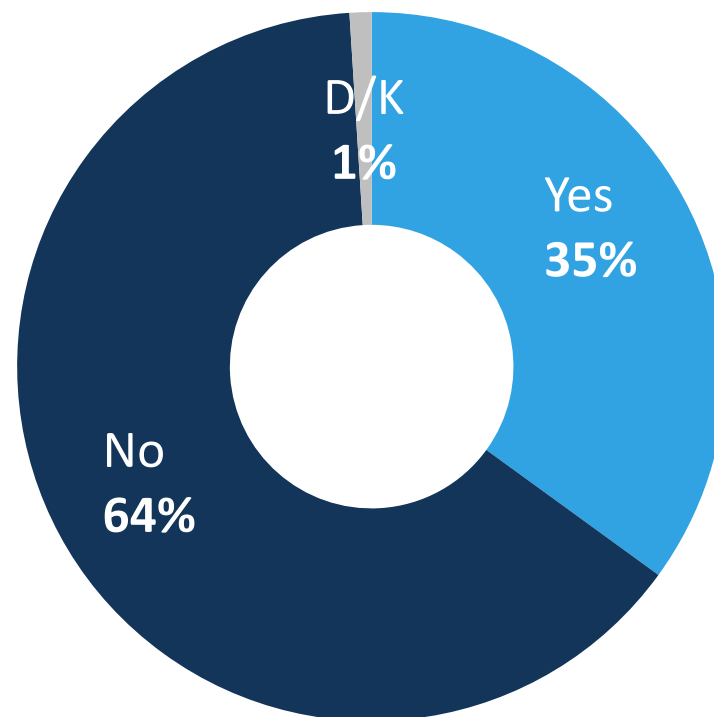
Perceptions about PrEP

“As far as you know, how **effective** is PrEP in protecting people who take it from getting HIV?”



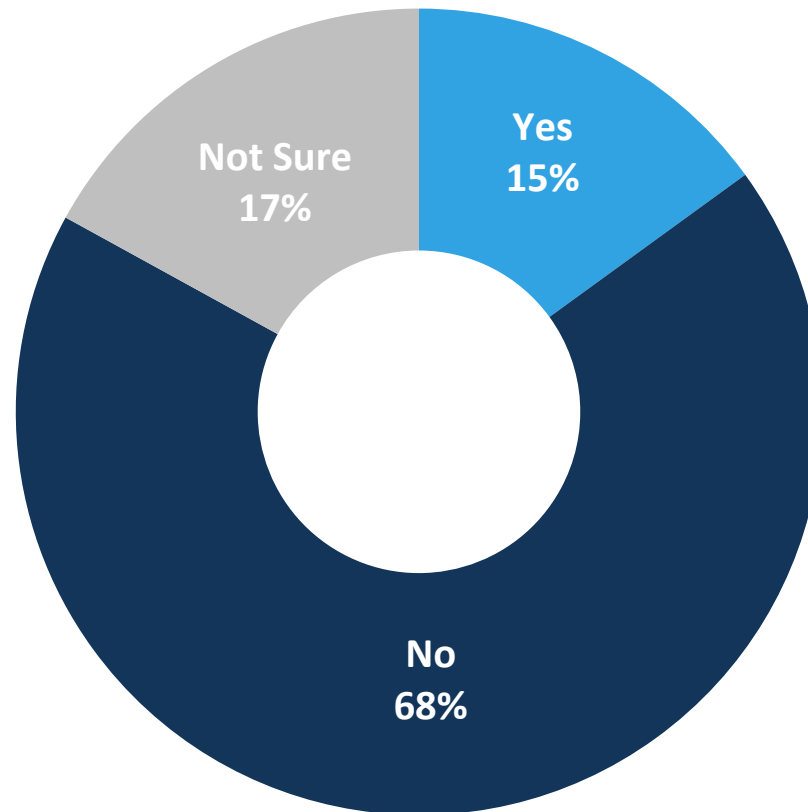
“Do you think most people in the U.S. who want PrEP are **able to get it**, or not?”



Know Someone Who has Used PrEP

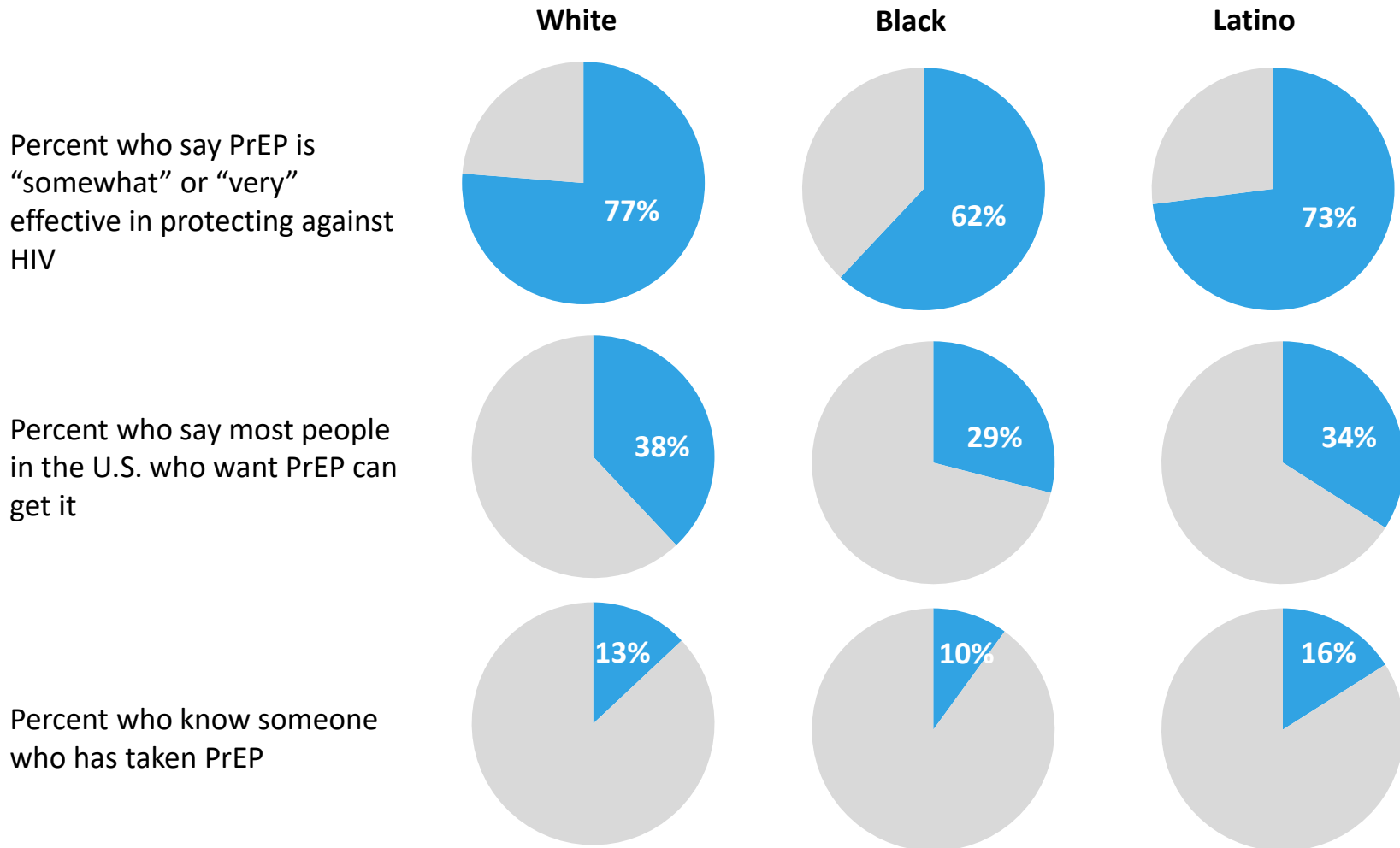
Among 18-30 year olds in the United States who have heard anything about PrEP

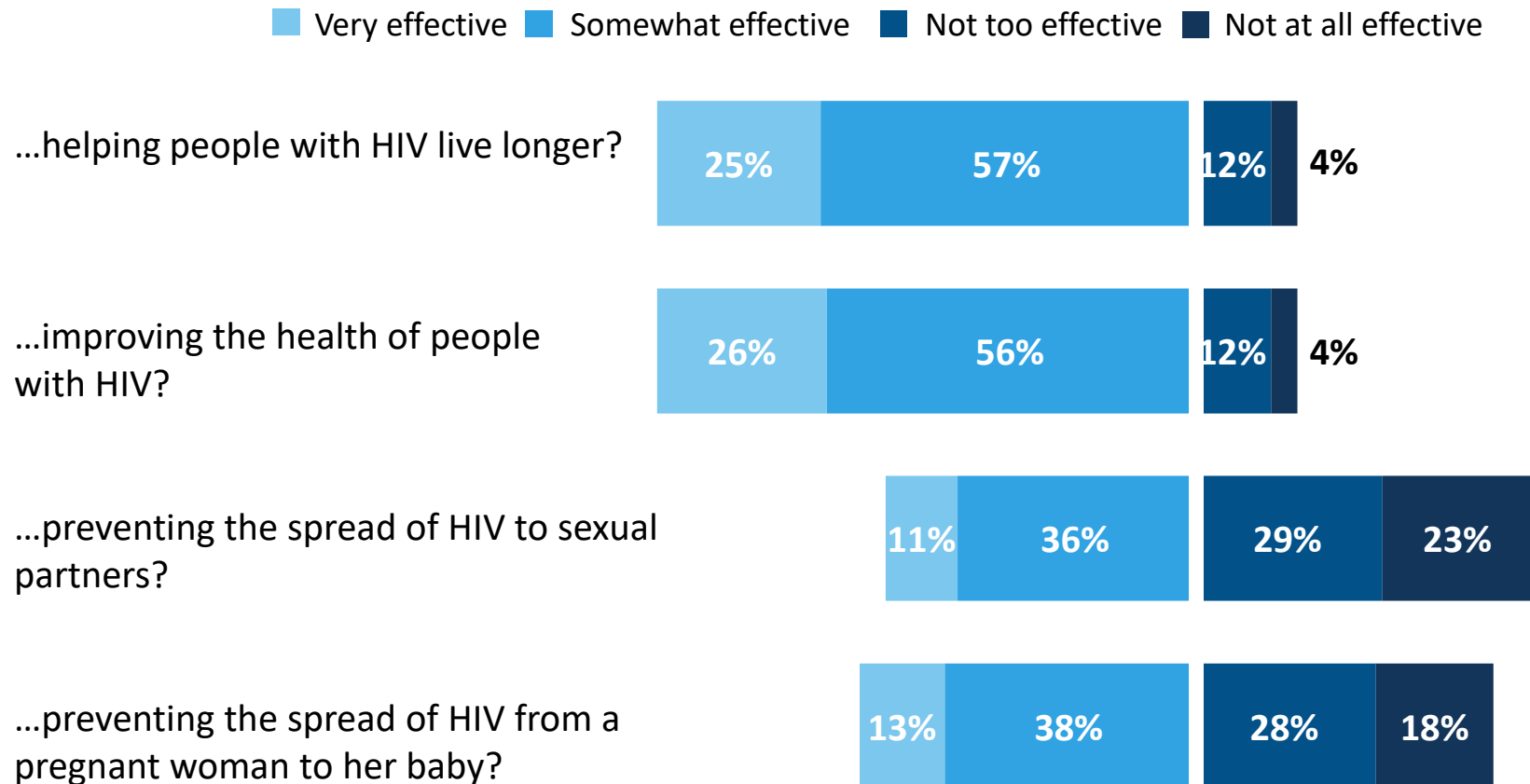

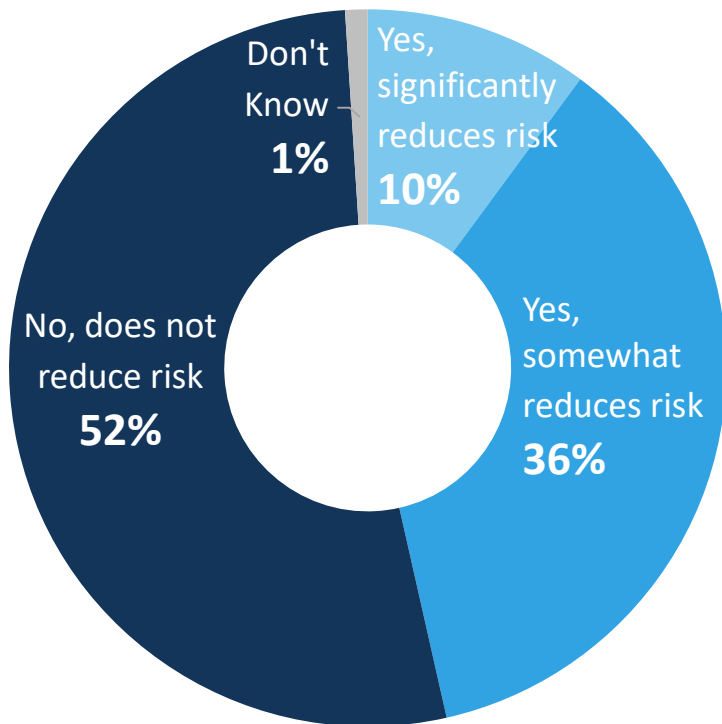
“Antiretrovirals (ARVs) are the medications to treat people living with HIV. As far as you know, how effective, if at all, are current treatment options in terms of each of the following...”



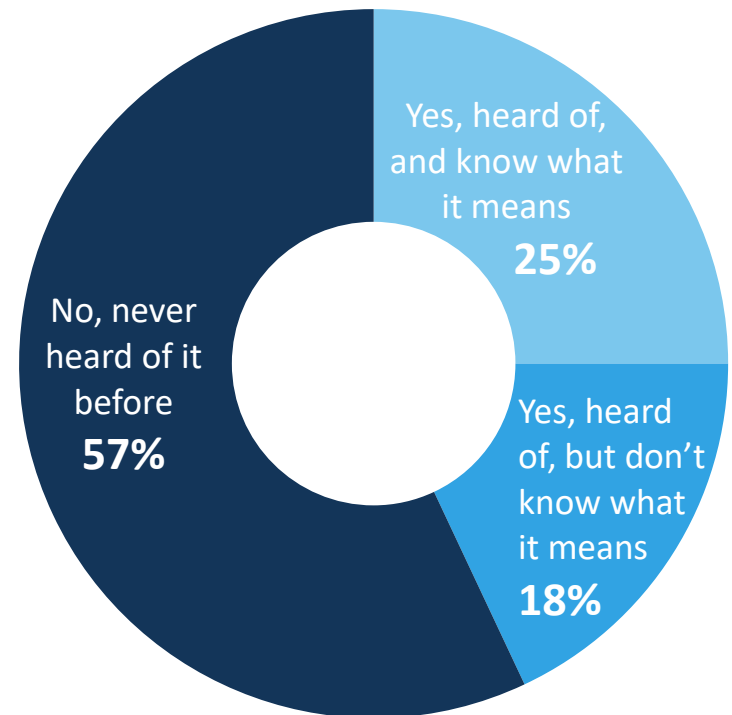
Understanding Treatment as Prevention

“With ongoing antiretroviral treatment, some people with HIV can become undetectable. Have you heard this term before, or not?”



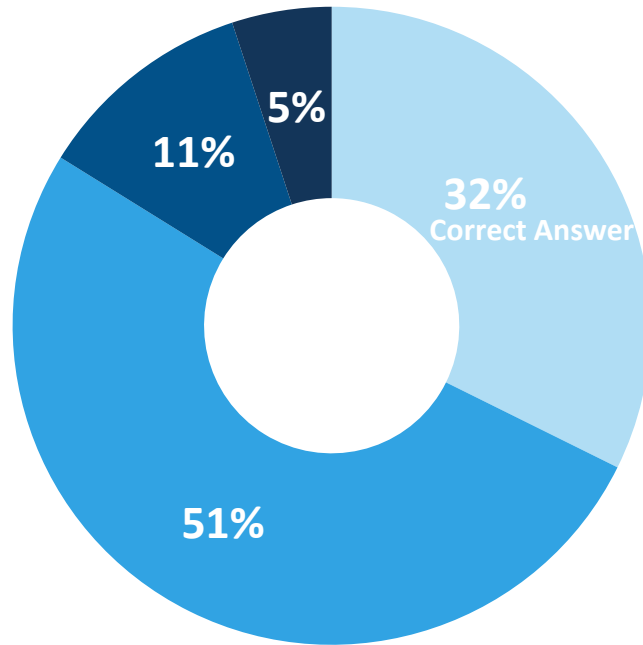

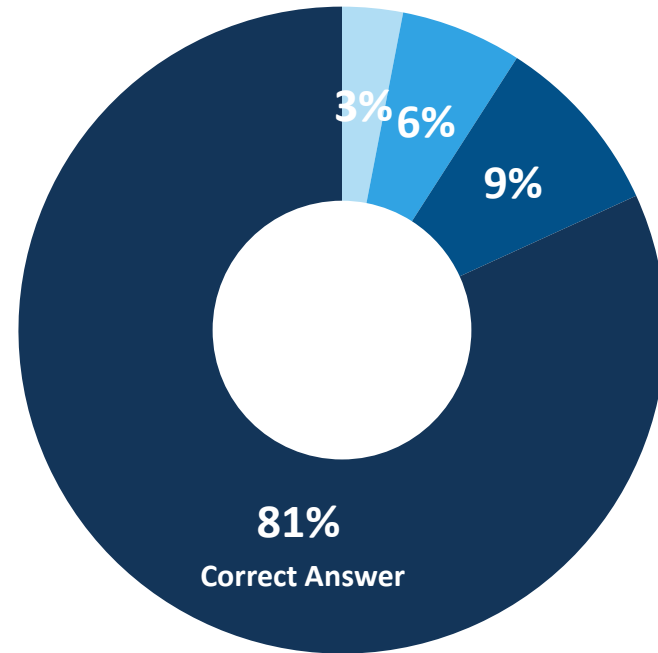

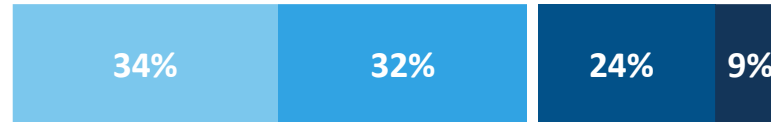

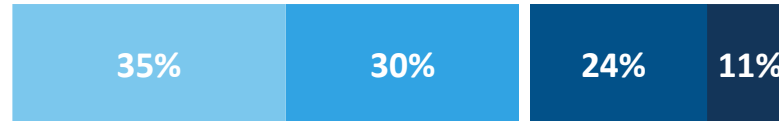

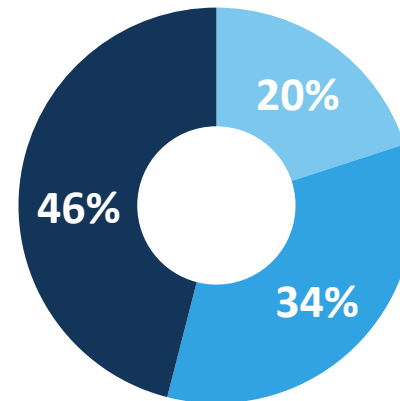

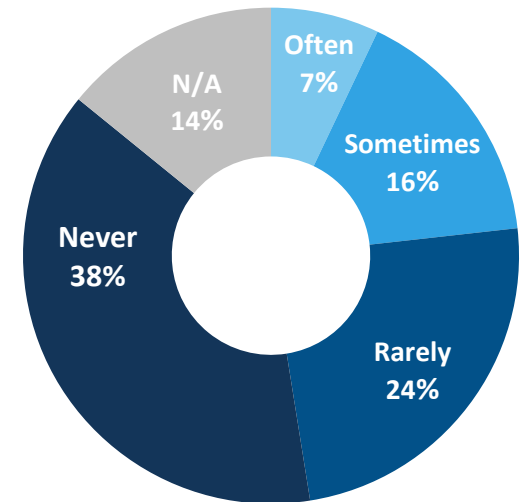

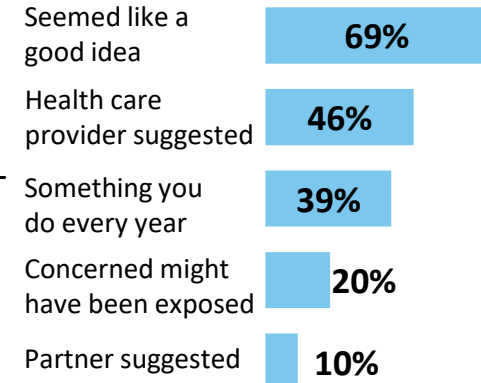

Reason(s) have not been tested (all that apply)



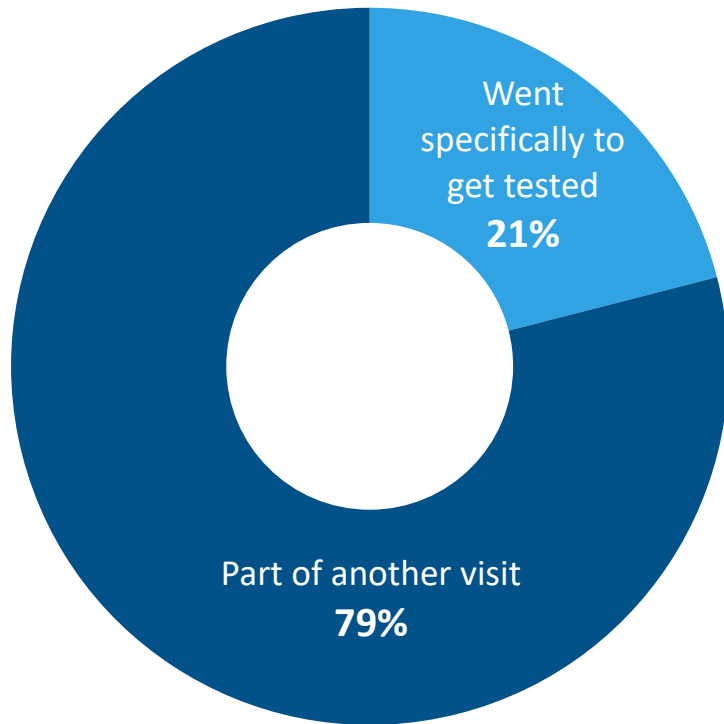

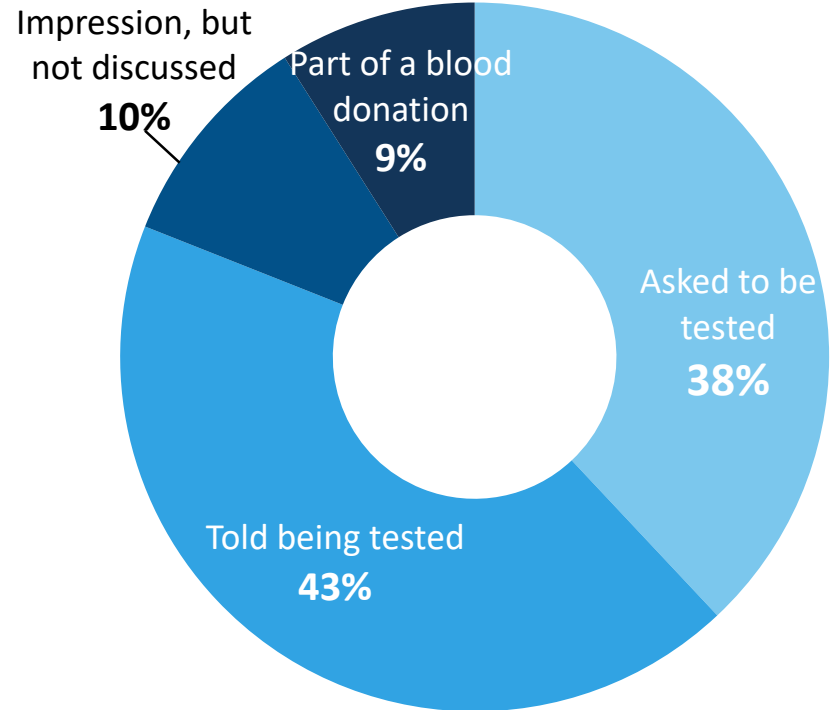
More about HIV Testing

“Was it part of another health visit, such as a routine check-up?”



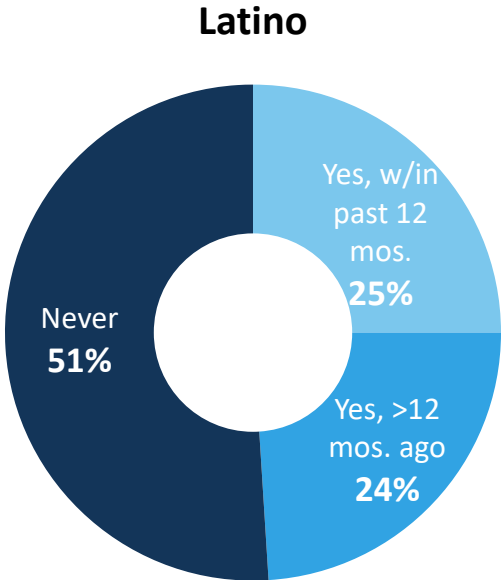
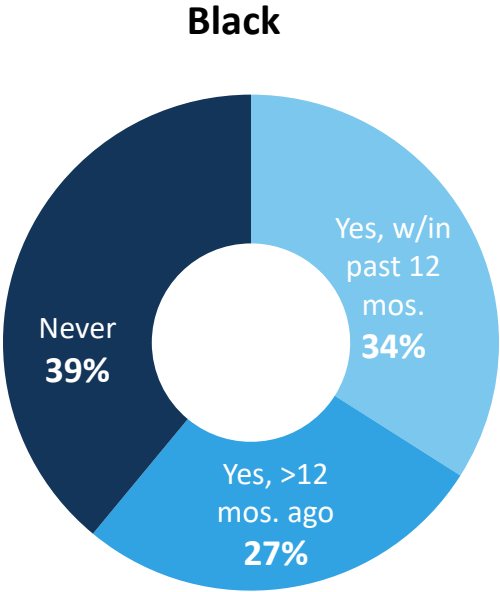
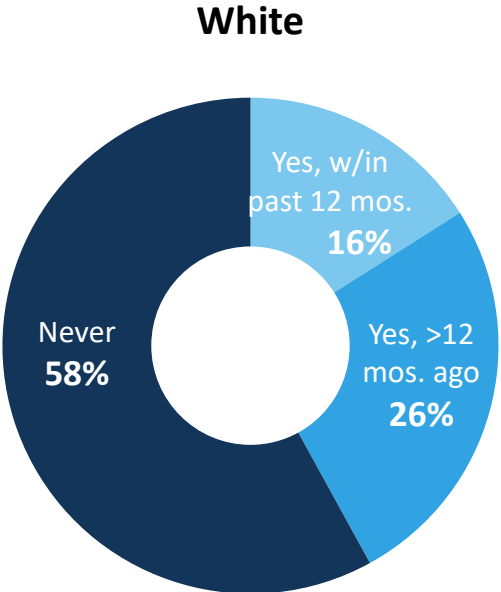

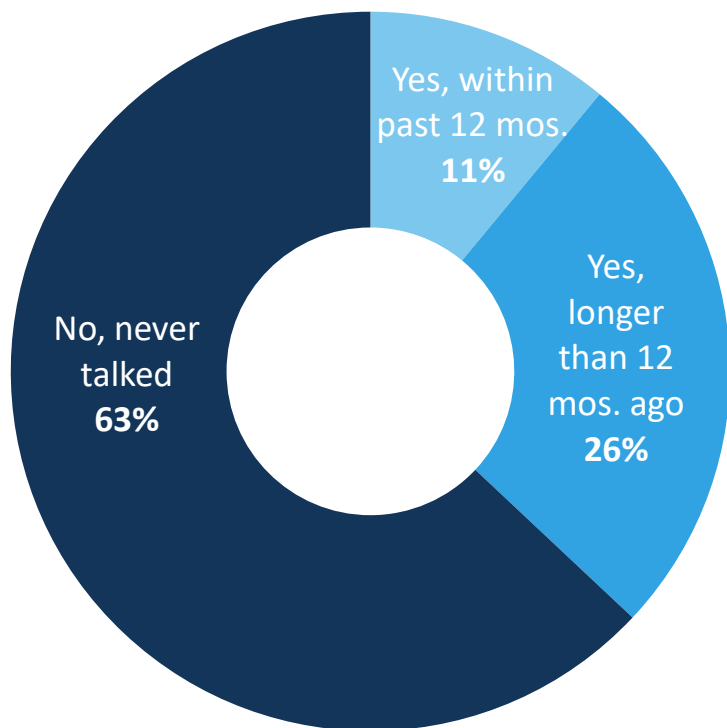

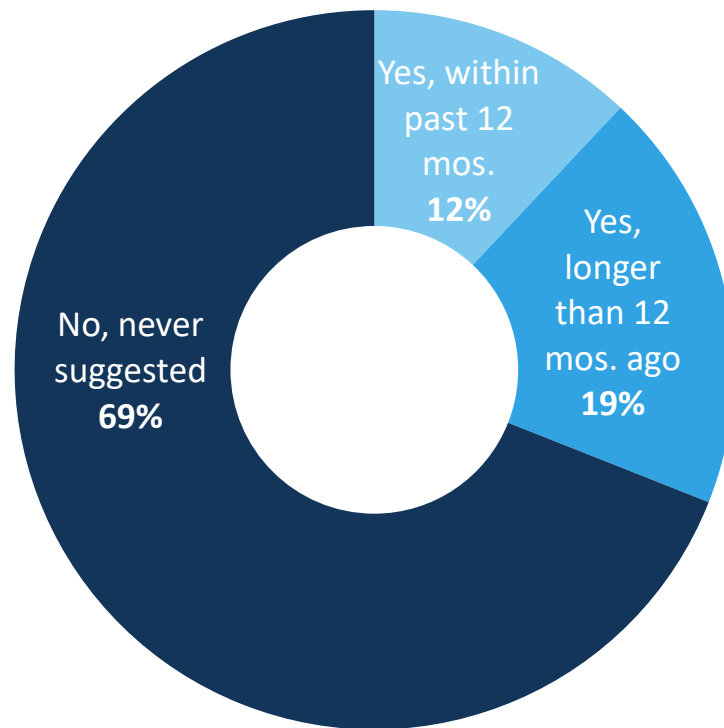

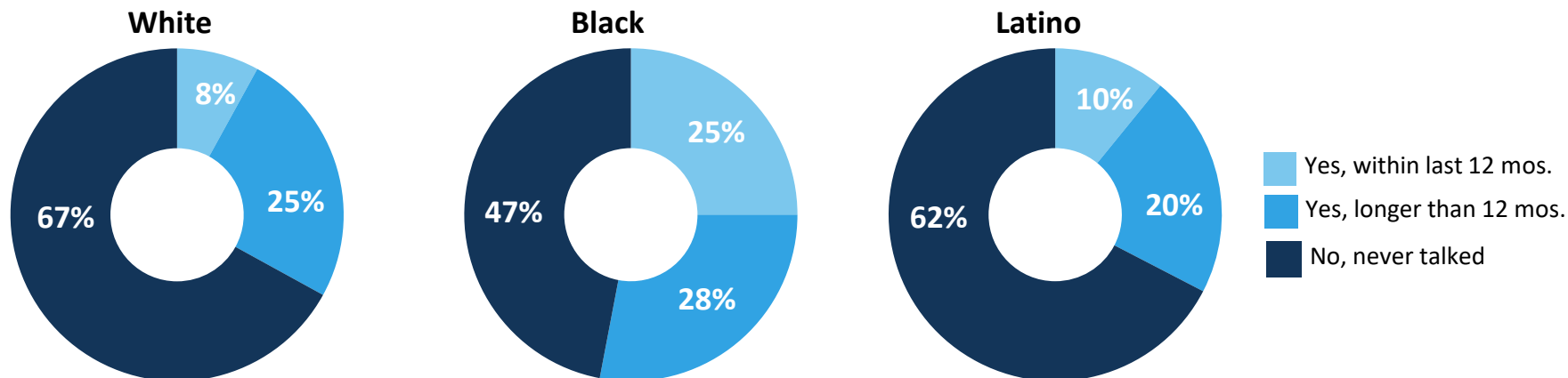

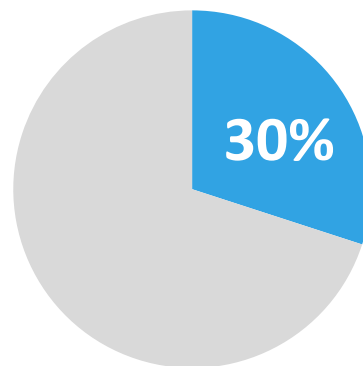

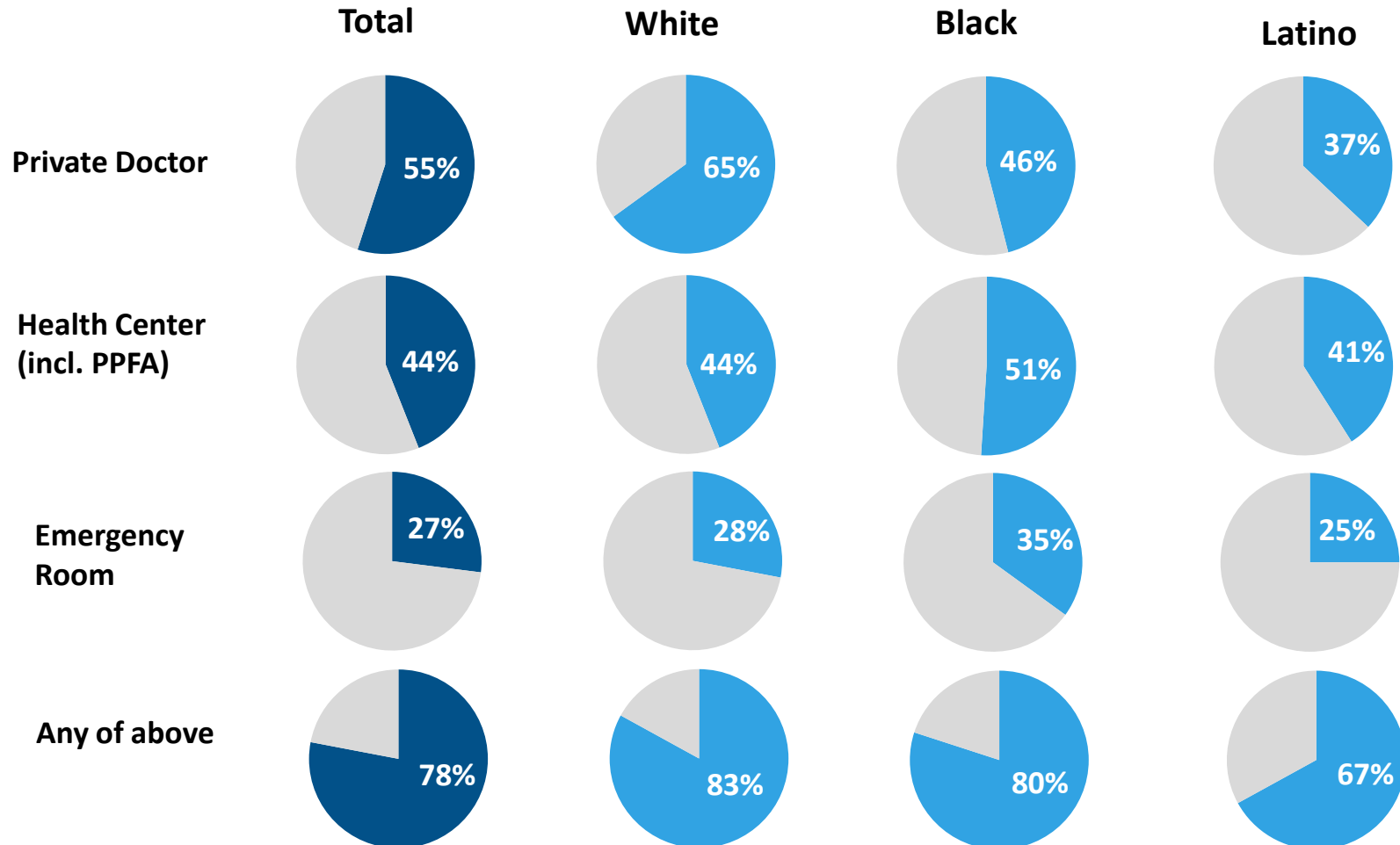

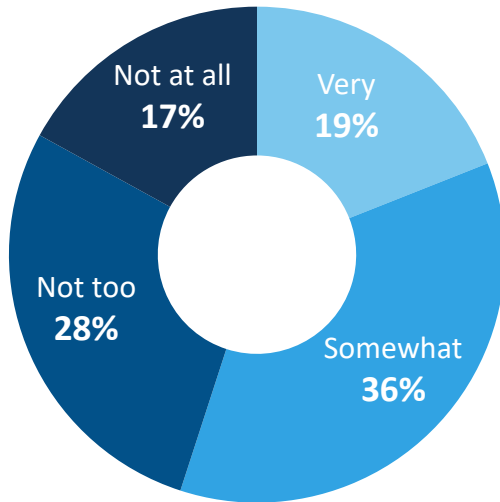

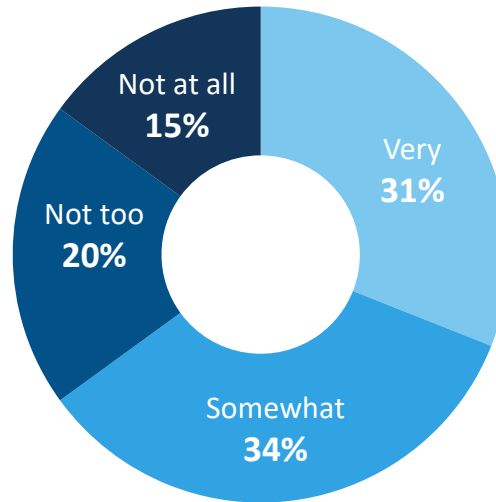
