

Hispanics are projected to account for more than 1 in 4 people living in the U.S. by 2060. 2060


#### Hispanics make up a greater share of the population in the west.

SHARE OF TOTAL POPULATION THAT IS HISPANIC BY STATE, 2017




Most nonelderly Hispanics are in a family with a worker, but are more likely to be poor than Whites.


HEALTH STATUS AND SELECTED HEALTH CONDITIONS AMONG **NONELDERLY ADULTS, 2017** 








## Among nonelderly adults, Hispanics face greater barriers to accessing care than Whites.




## Hispanics are more likely to have other characteristics that lead to health challenges.
