






A majority (61%) of Medicaid adults are working in Alabama

Medicaid eligibility limits as a percent of the federal poverty level (FPL)*



Total Medicaid spending in Alabama is \$7.9 billion





In Alabama Medicaid, people ages 65+ and people with disabilities are 30% of enrollees but account for 66% of spending


