







Medicaid eligibility limits as a percent of the federal poverty level (FPL)*



Total Medicaid spending in the District of Columbia is \$4.2 billion





In D.C. Medicaid, people ages 65+ and people with disabilities are 23% of enrollees but account for 60% of spending


