





#### Medicaid eligibility limits as a percent of the federal poverty level (FPL)\*



#### **Total Medicaid spending in Kansas is \$5.2** billion





In Kansas Medicaid, people ages 65+ and people with disabilities are 27% of enrollees but account for 67% of spending


