3 in 10 (34%) live in a rural area

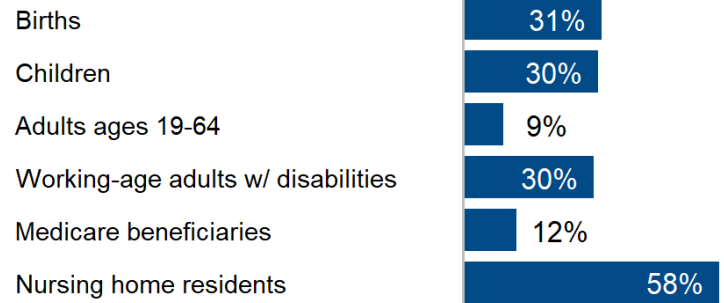
1 in 6 (17%) have three or more chronic conditions

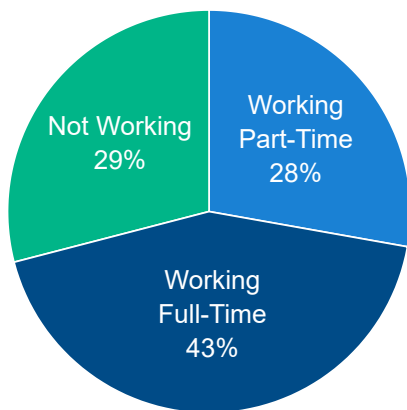

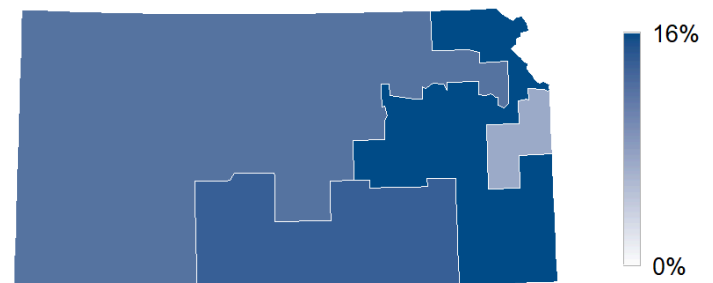
In Kansas, Medicaid covers...



A majority (71%) of Medicaid adults are working in Kansas

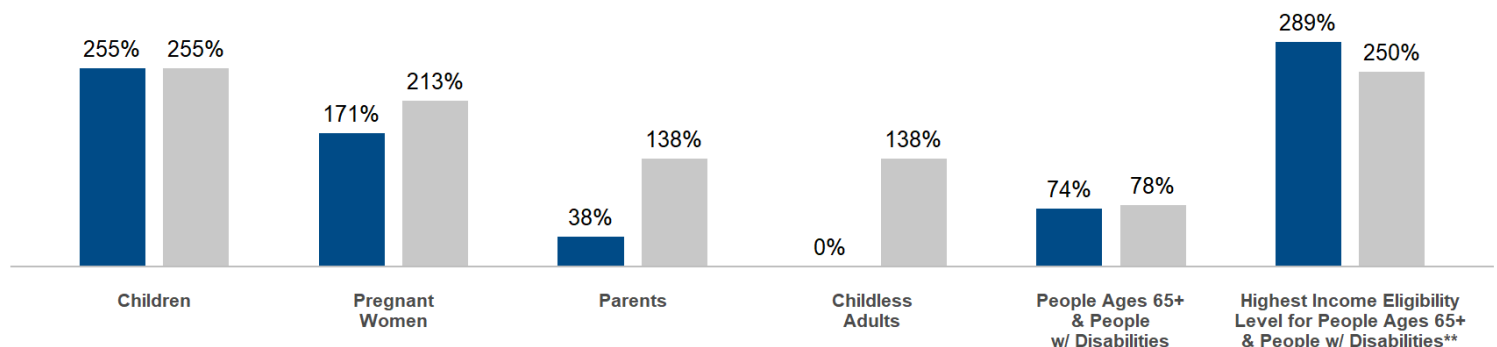


Medicaid covers from 7% to 16% of people in KS's congressional districts



Medicaid eligibility limits as a percent of the federal poverty level (FPL)*

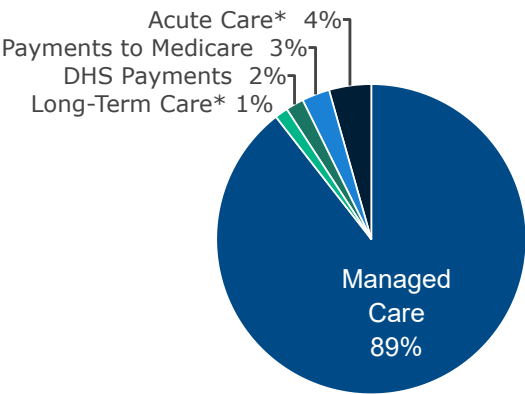
■ Kansas ■ U.S. Median



*The FPL in 2025 is \$26,650 for a family of three and \$15,650 for an individual.

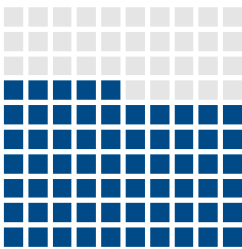
**To qualify for Medicaid at the higher income eligibility levels, individuals must meet requirements for the buy-in program for working age people with disabilities.

Total Medicaid spending in Kansas is \$5.2 billion



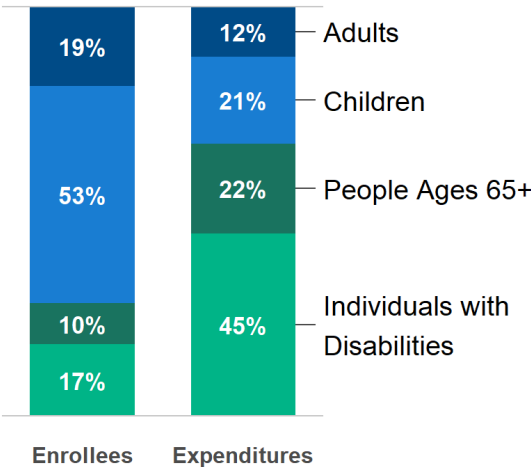

Financing for Medicaid is shared by states and the federal government; Kansas receives \$3.4 billion in federal Medicaid funding



Federal funding is 65% of total Medicaid spending in Kansas

In Kansas Medicaid, people ages 65+ and people with disabilities are 27% of enrollees but account for 67% of spending

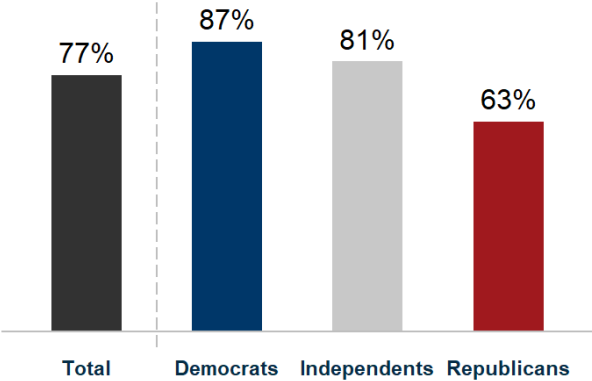


Per enrollee Medicaid spending is higher for individuals receiving institutional care
