






#### Medicaid eligibility limits as a percent of the federal poverty level (FPL)\*

### **Total Medicaid spending in Maryland is \$17** billion





# In Maryland Medicaid, people ages 65+ and people with disabilities are 16% of enrollees but account for 45% of spending


