







Medicaid eligibility limits as a percent of the federal poverty level (FPL)*






Total Medicaid spending in Mississippi is \$6.3 billion





In Mississippi Medicaid, people ages 65+ and people with disabilities are 35% of enrollees but account for 66% of spending




Per enrollee Medicaid spending is higher for individuals receiving institutional care
