

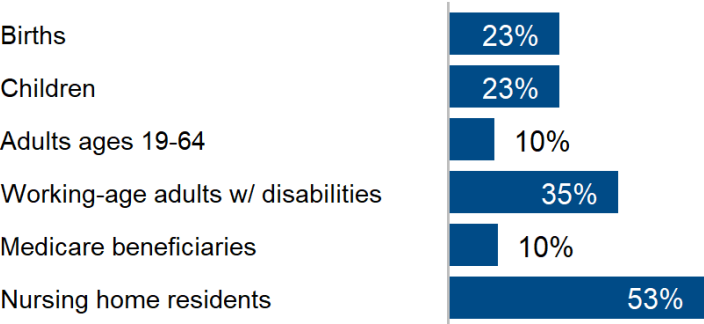
105,000 children and adults are enrolled in North Dakota Medicaid

Among all Medicaid enrollees in North Dakota:

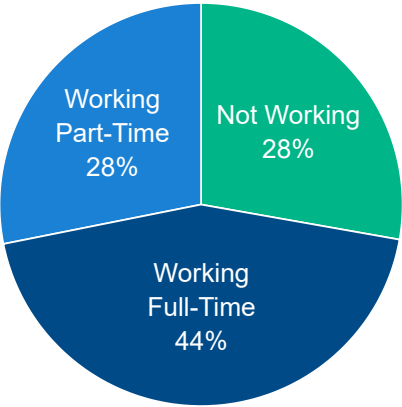
- 2 in 5 (43%) are children
- 1 in 2 (54%) live in a rural area
- 1 in 6 (16%) have three or more chronic conditions

In North Dakota, Medicaid covers...



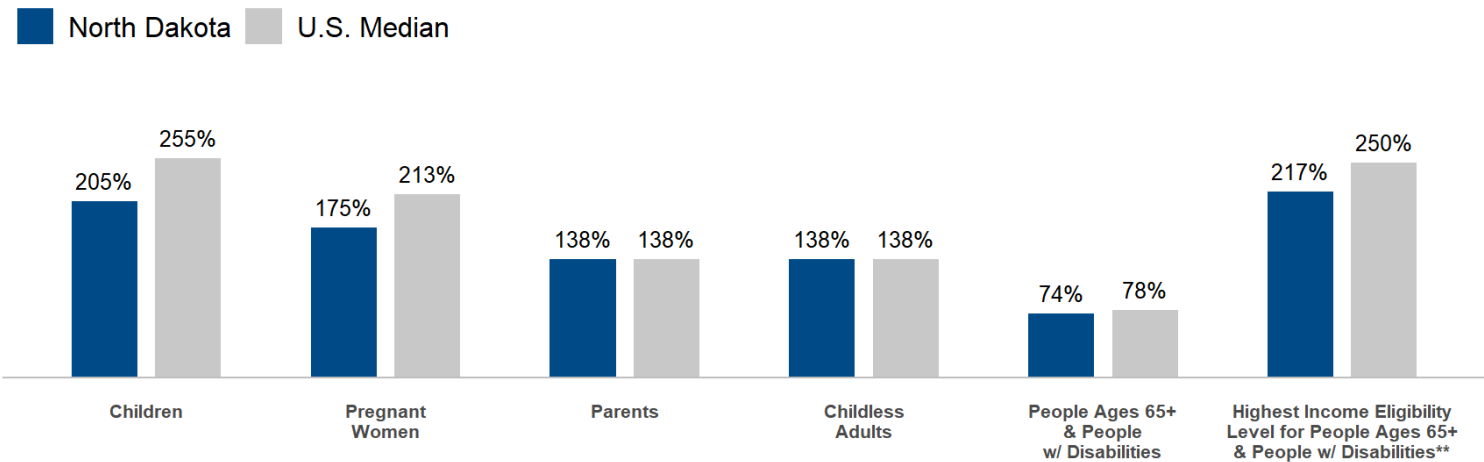
A majority (72%) of Medicaid adults are working in North Dakota



Medicaid covers 13% of people in ND's only congressional district

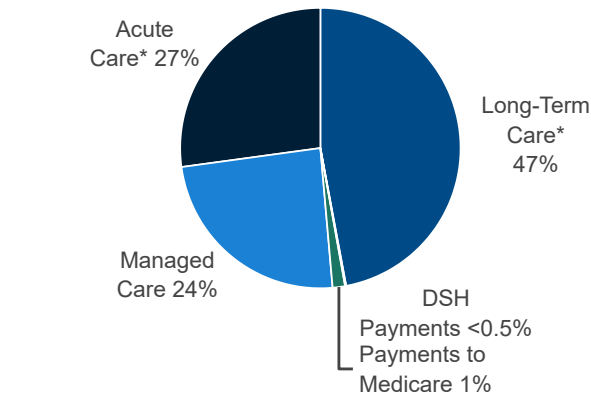


Medicaid eligibility limits as a percent of the federal poverty level (FPL)*



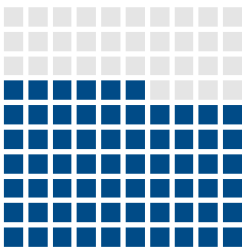
*The FPL in 2025 is \$26,650 for a family of three and \$15,650 for an individual.
**To qualify for Medicaid at the higher income eligibility levels, individuals must meet requirements for the buy-in program for working age people with disabilities.

Total Medicaid spending in North Dakota is \$1.5 billion



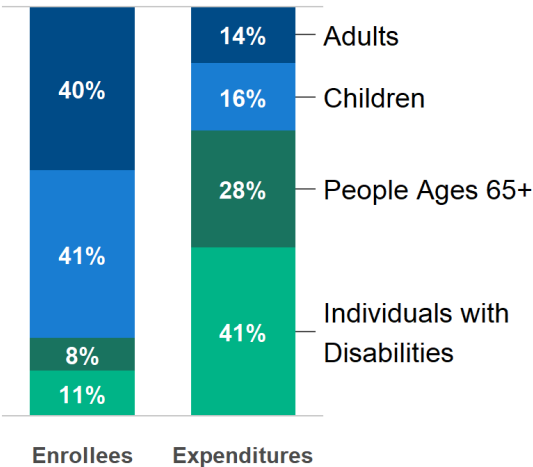
*Fee-for-Service

Financing for Medicaid is shared by states and the federal government; North Dakota receives \$1 billion in federal Medicaid funding



Federal funding is 66% of total Medicaid spending in North Dakota

In North Dakota Medicaid, people ages 65+ and people with disabilities are 19% of enrollees but account for 69% of spending

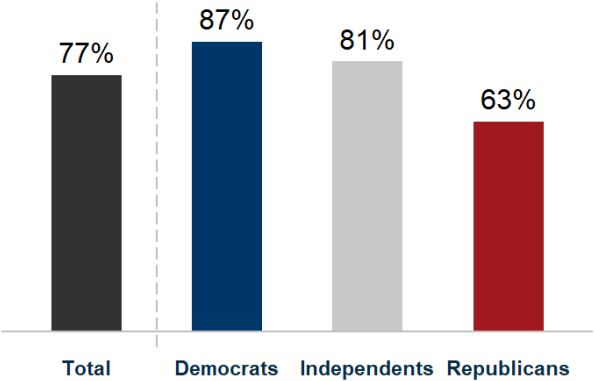


Per enrollee Medicaid spending is higher for individuals receiving institutional care
