**2 in 5 (42%)** live in a rural area

**1 in 8 (13%)** have three or more chronic conditions




## In New Hampshire, Medicaid covers...



## A majority (75%) of Medicaid adults are working in New Hampshire




## Medicaid covers 13% of people in both of NH's two congressional districts



## Medicaid eligibility limits as a percent of the federal poverty level (FPL)\*



\*The FPL in 2025 is \$26,650 for a family of three and \$15,650 for an individual.


\*\*To qualify for Medicaid at the higher income eligibility levels, individuals must meet requirements for the buy-in program for working age people with disabilities.

**Total Medicaid spending in New Hampshire is \$2.5 billion**





**Financing for Medicaid is shared by states and the federal government; New Hampshire receives \$1.5 billion in federal Medicaid funding**



Federal funding is **61%** of total Medicaid spending in New Hampshire

**In New Hampshire Medicaid, people ages 65+ and people with disabilities are 19% of enrollees but account for 50% of spending**




**Per enrollee Medicaid spending is higher for individuals receiving institutional care**
