




A majority (68%) of Medicaid adults are working in Tennessee

Medicaid eligibility limits as a percent of the federal poverty level (FPL)*



Total Medicaid spending in Tennessee is \$12.6 billion





In Tennessee Medicaid, people ages 65+ and people with disabilities are 29% of enrollees but account for 52% of spending


