








# Rapid Isolation and Treatment of Ebola RITE roll-out appears to be decreasing duration of outbreaks in Liberia

Size of circle proportional to number of cases in cluster; colors indicate different districts










## Modeling from September predicted rapid rise in cases – and rapid decline








# FY 2015 CDC emergency budget supplemental funding \$1.77 billion to fight Ebola on all fronts


### Goals


